
Celebrating our charity partners

Over the last few years, many charities, including those supported by the Trust, faced real challenges. Funding in numbers

We funded charities across the UK and internationally working towards a vision for people of all ages to have safe, healthy, fulfilled lives with access to high quality healthcare, water, hygiene and sanitation services.

Response to Cost of Living crisis

Throughout this strategy period, we recognize that cost pressures related to the cost of living crisis in the UK affected charities in a number of ways. In response, in 2023 we gave £100,000 of additional unrestricted funding to all of our long-term charity partners, providing them with a much-needed boost in income at the end of a challenging year.

Case Study

WaterAid



WaterAid's purpose is to make clean water, decent toilets and good hygiene normal for everyone, everywhere. Together with their supporters and partners around the world, WaterAid have reached close to 30 million people with clean water and decent toilets. Flexible funding from Postcode Global Trust allows WaterAid to reach remote areas of the world with WASH services, such as Manjakandriana in Madagascar. When the project began, only 1 in 4 people in Manjakandriana had access to clean water. By the end of the project, that figure was more than 3 in 4 people. This means almost 2000 people now have access to decent toilets and almost 8000 people have the tools to carry out good hygiene practices, helping to prevent the spread of disease.







Postcode Global Trust is a registered charity with the Scottish charity regulator OSCR (SC044038) and has been in operation since 2013. The trust operates its own society lottery and receives all its funding from the players of People's Postcode Lottery.

An independent board of trustees is legally responsible for the governance of the trust and how it is managed.
